

## Brief introduction to the history of archery

- > Based on excavations and cave paintings, it is known that the bow and arrow were developed about 60,000 years ago.
- > It started to be used as a weapon of war and a competitive sports equipment at the same time about 10,000 years ago.
- > Since 1972, archery has been an integral part of the Olympics.

## Safety rules

The guideline applies: "Archery is dangerous!"

For this reason, this sport should be specially trained,

and the safety rules must be followed.

The most important are summarized here:

- The arrow's tip should never be pointed at people or animals, but rather towards the ground or target.
- The bow should only be drawn at the shooting line.
- > The arrow is only nocked (at the shooting line) once all archers are at or behind the shooting line.
- > The arrow is always pointed at the target when being nocked and the bow is always held vertically.
- > The draw should never be over the shoulder line. No long shots should be done!
- Archers that are drawing their bows should never be distracted, disturbed, or even scared.
- Comfortable, tight-fitting clothing should be worn long hair should be tied together, the drawing cords of jackets or neckties should be covered, necklaces, earrings, piercings, wrist watches and bracelets should be taken off.
- > The equipment should be checked especially before shooting: e.g. arrow shaft, arrow nock, bowstring (whether damaged or secured in the bow nock on both ends; damage), etc. ...
- The bow should not be dry fired (shot without an arrow)! The bow could break.
- The arrows should always be collected as a group (at a signal). Archers should always approach the target from the side.
- > Archers should not bend over in front of the target as long as there are still arrows stuck in it.
- > When pulling the arrows, archers should make sure that no one else is behind them.

THE FOLLOWING APPLIES: One should never touch another's equipment without express permission!
